Separation & Adjustment

- To enter classroom with ease
- To separate from parent/caregiver
- To play in a variety of classroom areas
- To become easily involved in classroom activities
- To handle transitions and changes in routine with ease

Emotional Development

To accept limits To deal with frustration To be willing to try new things

Interaction with Adults

To talk to teachers To follow direction To ask for and accept appropriate assistance

Interaction with Peers

To enter play with ease To play near peers To play with at least one child in the class To begin to develop conflict resolution skills To begin to develop strategies for sharing and taking turns To participate at group/circle time

Speech, Language & Cognitive Development

- To use speech that is intelligible most of the time To express thoughts and needs
- To speak in simple sentences (2-4 words)
- To label most body parts, shapes and colors
- To recognize own written name
- To focus for an appropriate time

Artistic Expression/Dramatic Play

To be willing to try a variety of art media To engage in make-believe play

Self Help Skills

To attempt to dress and undress independently To show interest in using the toilet To clean up (snack, clean-up time) To be able to serve and pour at snack time

Gross Motor Skills

To demonstrate coordination skills in gross motor tasks like running, jumping, climbing, etc.

Fine Motor Skills

To handle small manipulatives (beads, puzzles, etc.) To hold a writing utensil To begin to draw with control To be able to draw vertical and horizontal lines To begin to use scissors
